

#### Conversations with Jesus

  - (Love God above all and love your neighbor)
- Expectations. (Carry you cross)
- Faith will save you.
- When they had the wrong attitude towards God. (Pharisees, Peter)

#### Characteristics of Christ's Conversations

- Jesus met people where they were.
- Jesus was upfront with people. He did not condemn, but He did not let people off of the hook.
- Jesus spoke with compassion.



# Jesus Met People Where They Where

 One of the best examples of meeting people where they where was Jesus' use of parables. Jesus used parables that contained everyday images His audience could relate to.

(Luke 15: 11-32: Parable of the Lost Son)

 Jesus knew who was talking with and listened to their thoughts. He let them express their ideas.

(Matt 16:15-16: Jesus asks his apostles who they thought He was.)

 Jesus knew the people that needed Him the most and made sure He talked with them.


(Luke 19: 1-10: Zacchaeus the Tax Collector)

# The Healing at the Pool

- Some time later, Jesus went up to Jerusalem for one of the Jewish festivals. <sup>2</sup> Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. <sup>3</sup> Here a great number of disabled people used to lie—the blind, the lame, the paralyzed. <sup>5</sup> One who was there had been an invalid for thirty-eight years.
- <sup>6</sup> When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, "Do you want to get well?"
- <sup>7</sup> "Sir," the invalid replied, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me."
- 8 Then Jesus said to him, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk." 9 At once the man was cured; he picked up his mat and walked. John 5: 1-9


# The Healing at the Pool

- At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. <sup>10</sup> Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"
- 11 "No one, sir," she said.
- "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."
- John 8: 9-11


#### Application for Us
