Typical Definition

- ▶ love noun
- ▶ \ 'ləv \
- ▶ Definition of love
 - ▶ (1): strong affection for another arising out of kinship or personal ties // maternal love for a child
 - ▶ (2): attraction based on sexual desire: affection and tenderness felt by lovers
 - // After all these years, they are still very much in love.
 - ▶ (3) : affection based on admiration, benevolence, or common interests
 - // love for his old schoolmates

Biblical Love – 4 Kinds



Eros - ἔρως

- Not used in New Testament
- Word carried over into our language: Erotic, Eroticism.
- Only for marriage
- The most spiritually dangerous when misapplied
- It deals with sexual interest, arousal, and/or fulfillment.
- "Passionate feelings which desires the other person for themselves."
- "Seeks to satisfy a strong urge or need within—with a certain person."



Philia - Φιλία

- Natural and Unforced Friendship
- ▶ Brotherly Love Philadelphia φιλαδελφία
- Affection, delight in the presence of another, warm feelings
- Relatively easy to enjoy
- Shared interests
- ▶ Rom. 12:10 "Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. "
- "No longer do I call you servants... but I have called you friends" (Joh. 15:15)



Storge - Στοργή

- Family
- Familial Affection or Fraternal
 - ▶ Family members or close acquaintance
- Could apply to animals such as pets
 - Possibly Unhealthy
- Rom. 1:31; 2 Tim. 3:3 astorgos—"without natural affection" (unloving—NKJV)



Agape - Άγάπη

- "Godly love"
- Not affection or sexual feelings
 - ▶ Not an impulse of feelings.
- ▶ It is an exercise of the mind or the will
- "I will try to think, speak, and act towards another in a way that is best for them, not for me necessarily, regardless of my feelings for or about them."
- Commanded by God. (Jn. 13:34)
- Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins. (1Pe. 4:8)
