

Romans 5:1-5 (NIV)

I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. The creation waits in eager expectation for the sons of God to be revealed. For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the glorious freedom of the children of God..

We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what he already has? But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently

Hope is what sustains us as we wait for part of the "glory" that is to be our eternal inheritance

Hope Sustains us...

- During "this age."
- In "our present sufferings"
- As we live as fallen people with broken relationships
- In a fallen world involving natural disasters, disease (COVID 19, cancer, etc.) and death.
- Until "the age to come" when glory will be revealed both in and to us.

We are already daughters and sons of God but we do not yet have our full inheritance.

Even Creation, The Physical Universe, Lives In Hope.

"the creation waits in eager expectation."

- This is compound word that means "to stretch out the head, to crane the neck forward."
- Philips translates it, <u>"Creation is on tiptoe."</u>


I Love How Eugene Peterson Translates This In *The Message*.

Romans 8:19-21 That's why I don't think there's any comparison between the present hard times and the coming good times. The created world itself can hardly wait for what's coming next. Everything in creation is being more or less held back. God reins it in until both creation and all the creatures are ready and can be released at the same moment into the glorious times ahead. Meanwhile, the joyful anticipation deepens.

Romans 8:22-25 All around us we observe a pregnant creation. The difficult times of pain throughout the world are simply birth pangs. But it's not only around us; it's within us. The Spirit of God is arousing us within. We're also feeling the birth pangs. These sterile and barren bodies of ours are yearning for full deliverance. That is why waiting does not diminish us, any more than waiting diminishes a pregnant mother. We are enlarged in the waiting. We, of course, don't see what is enlarging us. But the longer we wait, the larger we become, and the more joyful our expectancy.

Romans 8:26-28 Meanwhile, <u>the moment</u> we get tired in the waiting, God's Spirit is right alongside helping us along.

If we don't know how or what to pray, it doesn't matter. He does our praying in and for us, making prayer out of our wordless sighs, our aching groans. <u>He knows us far</u> <u>better than we know ourselves, knows our pregnant</u> condition, and keeps us present before God. <u>That's why</u> <u>we can be so sure</u> that every detail in our lives of love for God is worked into something good.
