Prayer Is Communicating With God

Hebrews 10:5-7 (NLT2)

“...when Christ came into the world, he said to God, “You did not want animal sacrifices or sin offerings. But you have given me a body to offer. You were not pleased with burnt offerings or other offerings for sin. Then I said, ‘Look, I have come to do your will, O God— as is written about me in the Scriptures.’””

Hebrews 5:7 (NIV)

Hebrews 7:25 (NLT2)

Purposes In Prayer

– A.C.T.S.

- Adoration
 - Confession
 - Thanksgiving
 - Supplication

Forms of Prayer

- Personal and/or Private
 - In Matthew 6:5, 6 the Lord tells His disciples to pray privately.
- Public and/or Communal
 - Acts 4:24 When they heard this, they raised their voices together in prayer to God. "Sovereign Lord," they said, "you made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and everything in them.

Adoration: Praise From A Heart Of Love

Psalm 100:1-5 (NIV)

Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth. Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs. Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

Confession: An Avenue of Spiritual Healing

- 1 John 1:9 (NIV)
If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.
- James 5:16 (NIV)
Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.

Prayers Can Be Sung

Dear Lord and Father of mankind,
forgive our foolish ways;
re clothe us in our rightful mind,
in purer lives thy service find,
in deeper reverence, praise.

Thanksgiving: Gratitude Expressed Privately and Communally

- 1 Thessalonians 5:17-18 (NIV)
pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.
- Psalm 95:1-2 (NIV)
Come, let us sing for joy to the LORD; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song.

Supplication: Making Requests For Self And Others.

- “Supplication” occurs nearly 60 times in Scripture. In most cases, it’s a person asking God for something on their own behalf. **It’s Not Selfish To Do So!**
- “Supplication” is also made on behalf of others. That is often what we call “Intercession.”
- 1 Timothy 2:1 (NIV)
I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone--

The Early Church Found Strength In Praying Collectively

- Church Historian, Everett Ferguson wrote of the prayers of the Church:
 - "The prayers preserved a strong sense of the community, of life in the church, in which the welfare of all was bound together. Thus Christians prayed together, and prayed 'our Father.' Prayer was the property of the whole people of God."

The Model Prayer, Though
Used With Latitude By The Early Church,
Was Intended To Be A Church Prayer.

It Isn't...

My Father in heaven, ... Give me bread for each day, forgive me my trespasses, lead me not into temptation, deliver me from evil (or the evil one)."

It is...

"Our Father, our bread, our forgiveness, us not being lead into temptation, and our deliverance from evil (evil one)."
