- Born in a stable
- Spent his early years in Egypt
- The son of a peasant girl and a tradesman who trained him to be carpenter, an ordinary trade
  - Raised in Nazareth – a *No-place* – not even mentioned in the Hebrew bible, the Jewish Talmud and Midrash, nor in any existing pagan writings.
- Crucified, a death reserved for slaves and traitors
  - Buried in a borrowed tomb

## “Sacred” And “Secular”


- Sacred: *connected with or dedicated to God*

or that does not pertain to God?*




## Colossians 3:1-24 (NIV)





And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.


