BUT, JOSEPH IS NOT ALONE!


Genesis 39:2-6 (NLT2)



Genesis 43:13-14 (NLT2)


Then take your brother, and go back to the man. May God Almighty give you mercy as you go before the man, so that he will release Simeon and let Benjamin return.


But if I must lose my children, so be it."











Genesis 45:1-8 (NLT2)


Genesis 45:13-15 (NLT2)
