The Church Is...

- Part of the Good News of Jesus.
 - The Bride of Christ.
 - The Body of Christ.
 - The Family of God.
- A People, a Community, a Living Organism intended to bring God's Light, Truth, Peace, and Goodness into all the world and every part of human society.

Acts 2:42-47 (NLT2)

All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer. A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had.

They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity—all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved.

Acts 4:32-35 (NLT2)

All the believers were united in heart and mind. And they felt that what they owned was not their own, so they shared everything they had. The apostles testified powerfully to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and God's great blessing was upon them all. There were no needy people among them, because those who owned land or houses would sell them and bring the money to the apostles to give to those in need.

Acts 5:1-4 (NLT2)

But there was a certain man named Ananias who, with his wife, Sapphira, sold some property. He brought part of the money to the apostles, claiming it was the full amount. With his wife's consent, he kept the rest. Then Peter said, "Ananias, why have you let Satan fill your heart? You lied to the Holy Spirit, and you kept some of the money for yourself...How could you do a thing like this? You weren't lying to us but to God!"

Acts 6:1 (NLT2)

But as the believers rapidly multiplied, there were rumblings of discontent. The Greek-speaking believers complained about the Hebrew-speaking believers, saying that their widows were being discriminated against in the daily distribution of food.

The Church Has The Power...

- To Unify and Divide.
- To Heal and Hurt.
- To Foster Relationships and Destroy Them.

History and Headlines Reveal The Truth

- The church has broken hearts, disappointed believers and even damaged the faith of some.
- It can be a deeply flawed, sinful, and unhealthy institution, marred by acts of injustice, corruption, abuse, misogyny, and oppression.
- It can be wrecked with bickering and division, celebrity worship and unaccountable leaders, false and shallow teaching, and a Christian industrial complex formed around greed and vanity.

How Do We Become The Church Of God's Intent?

- Acknowledge that we exist to be good news and to proclaim good news in word and actions.
- We exist to be Jesus to the world and to each other.
- As Jesus' representatives, we will seek justice for everyone, serve with humility, live transparent and confessional lives, admit and repent of our failures.
- We will seek to embody a culture that leads to healthy relationships and the goodness that is of God.

Tucked in midst of a series of ten miracles
where Jesus uses his power to save,
transform, rehabilitate and restore wounded
lives. We find the following verse just
before Jesus commissions the twelve to take
this same ministry to
“the lost sheep of Israel.”

Preach the message,
“The kingdom of heaven is near.”

Matthew 9:35-38 (NLT2)

Jesus traveled through all the towns and villages of that area, teaching in the synagogues and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom. And he healed every kind of disease and illness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them because they were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. He said to his disciples, “The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask him to send more workers into his fields.”

Why Pray For More Workers?

- Jesus was telling them that the world is filled with wounded people and they were to be wound healers.
- Many of these disciples were “wounded healers.”
- The church is to be a place that redeems these people.
- There are people all around us that have suffered rejection, intimidation, and victimization that need a safe place where they will be treasure for who they are, God’s image bearers, God’s very good creation.

What Does It Mean To Become A Culture Of Goodness?

Romans 3:10-18 (NLT2)

As the Scriptures say, “No one is righteous— not even one. No one is truly wise; no one is seeking God. All have turned away; all have become useless.
