


When The Pandemic Was Threatening...

What Is The Disease We Should Fear?

- Dietrich Bonhoeffer called the disease "cheap grace."
- A. W. Tozer called it "notable heresy."
- Dallas Willard has diagnosed the sickness with multiple terms, "Nondiscipleship Christianity," and a "Barcode" faith, which tends to produce what he calls a "vampire Christian."
- They are "consumers" not participants in the mission of God.

Jesus Said:

Matthew 28:19-20 (NIV)

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.

And surely I am with you always, to the very end

of the age."

We Have Gotten Distracted

- The mission is to make disciples but we've settled for making good church members; there's a difference.
- We often define good church members as those who:
 - Attend regularly
 - Serve in some capacity
 - Give consistently and sacrificially
 - And the really committed ones lead in some way

Disciples Are All For Those Things.

- But, they will flow out of being followers of Jesus.
- Disciples are those who:
 - Arrange their life to be with Jesus.
 - Intentionally pursue the character of Jesus.
 - Increasingly love what Jesus loves.
 - Are committed to the mission of God because of their devotion to Jesus.

Spiritual Leaders Are Focused On...

- Helping people order their everyday lives around a relationship with Jesus.
- Guiding toward being transformed from the inside out.
- How our programs and events are making transformation possible.
- Equipping people to live as disciples, who make disciples.

Paul Wrote: Romans 6:1-7 (NLT2)

Well then, should we keep on sinning so that God can show us more and more of his wonderful grace? Of course not! Since we have died to sin, how can we continue to live in it? Or have you forgotten that when we were joined with Christ Jesus in baptism, we joined him in his death?

For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives. Since we have been united with him in his death, we will also be raised to life as he was. We know that our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives. We are no longer slaves to sin. For when we died with Christ we were set free from the power of sin.

So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless. Now someone may argue, "Some people have faith; others have good deeds." But I say, "How can you show me your faith if you don't have good deeds? I will show you my faith by my good deeds."
