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



Disconnections








Saul Took David's *People*... "I had to," she lied. "He threatened to kill me if I didn't help him." (Samuel 19:17, TLB)








Saul Took David's <u>People</u>...

At last Jonathan said to David, "Go in peace, for we have made a pact in the LORD's name. We have entrusted each other and each other's children into the LORD's hands forever." Then David left, and Jonathan returned to the city. (Samuel 20:42, NLT)



So David escaped from Saul and went to King Achish of Gath. But Achish's officers weren't happy about his being there. "Isn't this David, the king of the land?" they asked. "Isn't he the one the people honor with dances, singing, 'Saul has killed his thousands, and David his ten thousands'?" (1 Samuel 21:10- 22:1)

2. Lies & Bizzarre Behavior


David heard these comments and was afraid of what King Achish might do to him. So he pretended to be insane, scratching on doors and drooling down his beard.

(1 Samuel 21:10- 22:1)





1) Have I been disconnected from the important relationships in my life?





1) Seek Refuge in God's Presence.

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Psalm 57...

"A song of David when he fled from Saul into the cave."

"A song of David when he fled from Saul into the cave."

Have mercy on me, my God, have mercy on me, for in you I take refuge. I will take refuge in the shadow of your wings until the disaster has passed.

(Psalm 57:1)

1) Seek Refuge in God's Presence.

"You'll never know that Jesus is all you need until Jesus is all you have."



2) Find Community With God's People. Then others began coming-men who were in trouble or in debt or who were just discontented-until David was the leader of 400 men. (1Samuel 22:1-2 NLT)

2) Find Community With God's People.

Take a good look, friends, at who you were when you got called into this life. I don't see many of "the brightest and the best" among you, not many influential, not many from high-society families.

(1 Cor. 1:26-30 MSG)

2) Find Community With God's People. Isn't it obvious that God deliberately chose men and women that the culture overlooks and exploits and abuses, chose these "nobodies" to expose the hollow pretensions of the "somebodies"? That makes it quite clear that none of you can get by with blowing your own horn before God. (1 Cor. 1:26-30 MSG)

2) Find Community With God's People. Everything that we have—right thinking and right living, a clean slate and a fresh start—comes from God by way of Jesus Christ. (1 Cor. 1:26-30 MSG)
