

Instead, he took the lamb from the poor man and cooked it for his visitor. (2 Sam. 12:4, NCV)




David burned with anger against the man and said to Nathan, "As surely as the Lord lives, the man who did this must die! (2 Samuel 12:5-6)



He must pay for that lamb four times over, because he did such a thing and had no pity. (2 Samuel 12:5-6)




"You are the man!" (2 Samuel 12:7)


Now, therefore, the sword will never depart from your house, because you despised me and took the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your own.
