

Perseverance

Washington Crossing the Delaware

- During the night of December 25, Washington led his troops across the ice-swollen Delaware about 9 miles north of Trenton. The weather was horrendous and the river treacherous. Raging winds combined with snow, sleet and rain to produce almost impossible conditions. To add to the difficulties, a significant number of Washington's force marched through the snow without shoes.
- The next morning they attacked to the south, taking the Hessian garrison by surprise and overrunning the town. After fierce fighting, and the loss of their commander, the Hessians surrendered.




Christian Perseverance

 - God's agreement with Satan.
 - Job's children died.
 - Job lost his wealth.
 - Job became covered with sores and suffered physical pain.
 - Job's wife and friends turned away from God and encouraged Job to do the same.



Defending His Faith

- Job's wife:
- ⁹ His wife said to him, "Are you still maintaining your integrity? Curse God and die!" Job 2:9
- Eliphaz (One of the three friends who visited Job):
 2"Can a man be of benefit to God?
 Can even a wise person benefit him?
 What pleasure would it give the Almighty if you were righteous?
 What would he gain if your ways were blameless? Job 22:2-3

- Do we hold on to our faith and believe that God is with us and He has a plan for us?


Job and God

¹⁰ After Job had prayed for his friends, the LORD restored his fortunes and gave him twice as much as he had before. Job 42:10


Doing the Right Thing

Jesus and the Sinful Woman

- ³⁶When one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, he went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. ³⁷ A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. 38 As she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them. 39 When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who is touching him and what kind of woman she is—that she is a sinner."
- 48 Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." 49 The other guests began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?"
