

There's a saying that people use that you may have heard from time to time:

"Didn't you see the handwriting on the wall?"

I would like to take you back this morning to where this saying originated.

The book of Daniel Chapter 5 tells us the story.

What you're about to see is a little of what happened. The main characters being Belshazzar, King of the Babylonian Empire and the prophet Daniel----

It's interesting to note that archaeologists have uncovered a room on the site of the palace of ancient Babylon. Located in Iraq they found that one wall was covered with plaster and measured 165 feet by 55 feet-big enough to be the banquet hall where Belshazzar held his feast.

#### The lesson for us is basically in four parts:

- 1. Everyone is being watched by God.
- 2. Our lives are being weighed by the righteous scales of God's justice.
- 3. We will be held accountable for our actions.
- 4. What we do with God now has a direct impact on how HE judges us later.



1. Everyone is being watched by God.

Job 28:24—He sees everything under the

2. Our lives are being weighed on the righteous scales of God's justice.

#### Romans 2:6-11 New International Version (NIV)

<sup>6</sup> God "will repay each person according to what they have done." <sup>7</sup> To those who by persistence in doing good seek glory, honor and immortality, he will give eternal life. 8 But for those who are selfseeking and who reject the truth and follow evil, there will be wrath and anger. <sup>9</sup> There will be trouble and distress for every human being who does evil: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile; <sup>10</sup> but glory, honor and peace for everyone who does good: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. <sup>11</sup> For God does not show favoritism.



## 3. We Will Be Held Accountable For Our Actions:

### **Revelation 20:11-15**

11Then I saw a great white throne and Him who was seated on it. The earth and the heavens fled from His presence, and there was no place for them. 12And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Another book was opened, which is the book of life. The dead were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books. 13The sea gave up the dead that were in it, and death and Hades gave up the dead that were in them, and each person was judged according to what they had done. 14Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the second death. 15 Anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire.
